## Slide Bolts - Exterior

Slide bolts are very commonly added to doors as secondary locking devices. These locks are popular for their ease of installation and strength. Slide bolts are most often held in place with bolts or screws. Slide bolts that are screwed in place generally pose little difficulty when forcing entry. The screws will pull out of the door or jamb they are screwed into without a tremendous amount of force being applied. Slide bolts that are bolted in place are much more substantial and must be dealt with properly if forcible entry is to be conducted in a timely manner.

Slide bolts can be installed on the interior or exterior of the door. Exterior in this case refers to the slide bolt on the opposite side of the door from the forcible entry firefighter. From the exterior firefighters will be able to make a reasonable assumption that a slide bolt is present from the bolt heads visible on the door. Slide



bolts are held in place by four or six bolts in most cases. There is no way to determine which locks are engaged on an outward opening door. For this reason, attempt conventional forcible entry

techniques first before moving on to specific slide bolt tactics. There is no reason to waste time attacking a slide bolt that is not locked.
